


#### **The SVR-Integration Barometer**

- Population without and with migration background in Germany aged
  15 and over
- Type of survey: computer-assisted telephone interviews (CATI)
- Realized sample: 15,095 cases
- Funding: Federal Ministry of the Interior and 16 Federal States
- Survey period: 25.11.2019 03.08.2020
- Sample design: dual-frame; disproportionate stratification by Federal States
- Multilingual survey: German, English, Turkish, Arabic, Russian, Farsi (2018 and 2020).




### "How strong is your interest in German politics in general?"


(percentage rather strong / very strong vs. rather weak / not interested at all)




# Internal political efficacy (I): "I am able to understand and assess important political questions"




## Internal political efficacy (II): "I feel confident to participate actively in a conversation about issues of German politics"




# Non-electoral political participation: Women with migration background are slightly more active than men

### Key factors for political engagement and civil society involvement

1 Resources (socio-economic, cognitive, educational, organisational), incl. networks

2 Motives and motivation (norms, values, political efficacy)

Migration-related: Language competency

4 Migration-related: Lenght of time spent in Germany

5 <u>External</u>: Create opportunity structures, engage women, support networking

#### **Implications for policy-making and programming**

- Volunteering and engaging in civil society are closely linked to political activity and electoral participation.
- Civil engagement in itself has a positive effect on social cohesion and integration but in the longer term it is also likely to lead to more participation at the political level.
- Involvement in civic associations and initiatives can act as a "school of democracy" by imparting skills, strengthening resilience and generating effectiveness. There is a particular role for (women) migrant organisations to play in building bridges.
- Promising approach: Low-threshold engagement programmes at local level, geared at womens' needs and harnessing their political and civil society potential.
